Sendezeit

The ten tracks of the new album "Sendezeit" (Airtime) prove pointedly that jazz, spoken word and witty scripts are not mutually excluding but rather formidably complementary. While anticipating his airtime, BARRY GOOD talks about the perils of the art and consumer industry, of the plebs and other human beings and describes climate change from the moon's perspective. Emotive dialect songs from Vorarlberg (West Austria) charmingly spark dreams, German spoken groove tracks instigate closer listening and introspection through poetic as well as bold incentives. Interspersed outliers such as the tango Selfie or the English medium-swing track Jimmy as well as the jazz-ballade about Wilhelm Busch's Vogel auf dem Leim make for curious variety. Ample space for improvisation allows the five virtuous musicians to convey an electrifying and authentic listening as well as concert experience and complements the thought through musical concept. Humorously and sustainably.

In 2009 Alois completed his Bachelor studies in Jazz Tombone with unanimous distinction and likewise finished his studies on the accordion under the tutelage of Alfred Melichar with outstanding success. He majored in classical Tombone performance under Dany Bonvin at the Mozarteum University in Salzburg in 2012. Other teachers include Christian Radovan, Dave Taylor (workshop), Dejan Pecenko, Christoph Cech, Doug Hammond, Harry Sokal and Peter Herbert.

Simon Raab

Born 1989 in Linz, studied jazz and classical piano at the Anton Bruckner University in Linz with Christoph Cech, Martin Stepanik and Hannes Loschel as well as at the University for Music in Basel, Switzerland with Malcolm Braff. Simon Raab emerged with bands such as "Listen to Leena", "Luzid Chaos" and through engagements with "ProBrass", Christoph Cech, Ulrich Drechsler, Judith Ferstl, Andreas Lachberger, Lorenz Raab, Alex Kranabetter, Hubert Bründlmayr, Beate Wiesinger, Vincent Pogracz and others.

Marc Vogel

Former student at the Jazz department of the Musicuniversity in Graz, with the main subject being Drum Set. The release of two albums, and an intense phase of touring (i. a. Kasachstan, Kirgisistan, Greece, Italy, Norway, Senegal, Indonesia, Kenia, Iceland, Argentinia, Chile) with the HDV Trio (Helbock-Dietrich-Vogel-Trio), was followed by a one year stay in Athens/Greece, combined with a musical time-out.
